Belvoir Castle – Engine Yard	Grantham NG32 1PE	28 miles	01476 871001	One of the finest examples of Regency architecture in the world. Tours of the state rooms, formal gardens and woodland trails. Visit the Engine Yard, home to artisan boutiques, a spa, the Balloon Gin Bar, Fuel Tank restaurant and the Duchess Gallery. OPEN: Mon-Sun 10am-5.30pm. CLOSED: Friday
Browne's Hospital and Museum	Stamford PE9 1PF	0.7 miles	01780 481834	Almshouses built in 1474, original furniture and stained glass. Call to book a guided tour, cost £3.50 per head. OPEN: For pre-booked tours only
Burghley House & Gardens	Stamford PE9 3JY	1.3 miles	01780 752451	One of the most impressive Elizabethan houses in England, with eighteen treasure-filled state rooms boasting a world-renowned collection of tapestries, porcelain and paintings. Sculpture garden, garden of surprises and deer park. Burghley Horse trials takes place every September. OPEN: March to October
Flag Fen Archaeology Park	Peterborough PE6 7QJ	18.5 miles	01733 864468	Flag Fen Archaeology Park is home to a kilometre-long wooden causeway and platform perfectly preserved in the wetland. 3300 years ago, this was built and used by the Prehistoric fen people as a place of worship and ritual. 60,000 upright timbers and 250,000 horizontal planks are buried under the ground. OPEN: Every day 30 th March to 30 th September 10am-5pm
Grimsthorpe Castle	Bourne PE10 0LY	12.3 miles	01778 591205	Gardens, extensive historic woodland and a 50-acre lake. Adventure playground and miles of traffic free trails. OPEN: 4 April to 30 May - Sundays, Thursday and Bank Holiday Mondays. 2 June to 30 September - Sunday to Thursday. Castle - 12pm-4pm. Park and Gardens - 10.30am-6pm.
Harlaxton Manor	Grantham NG32 1AG	23.6 miles	01476 403013	Built in 1837 Harlaxton's architecture, which combines elements of Jacobean and Elizabethan styles with symmetrical Baroque massing, renders the mansion unique among surviving Jacobethan manors. The house is now owned by the University of Evansville, Indiana, USA, and is used as their British Campus. OPEN: House and garden guided tours are by appointment only.
John Clare Cottage	Helpston PE6 7ED	7.1 miles	01733 253330	Widely regarded as one of the greatest of the English poets, John Clare lived in Helpston for his first forty years from 1793 until 1832. The Cottage has been restored, using traditional building methods. OPEN: Mon, Fri, Sat 11am-4pm

Lyddington Bede House	Lyddington LE15 9LZ	14.4 miles	0370 333 1181	Lyddington Bede House originated as the medieval wing of a palace belonging to the Bishops of Lincoln. Converted into an almshouse for 12 poor 'bedesmen' and two women. Visitors can wander through the bedesmen's rooms, with their tiny windows and fireplaces, and view the former bishops' Great Chamber with its beautifully carved ceiling cornice. OPEN: Wed-Sun 10am-6pm. CLOSED: Mon, Tue.
Oakham Castle	Oakham LE15 6DR	11.9 miles	01572 757578	Oakham Castle was constructed between 1180 and 1190 for Walchelin de Ferriers, Lord of the Manor of Oakham. The Castle is known for its collection of massive horseshoes and is also recognised as one of the best examples of domestic Norman architecture in England. Admission to the castle is free. OPEN: Mon 10am-4pm, Wed-Sat 10am-4pm, Sun 12pm-4pm. CLOSED: Tues
Peterborough Cathedral	Peterborough PE1 1XS	14.4 miles	01733 355315	Peterborough Cathedral is one of the finest Norman cathedrals in England. Founded as a monastic community in 654 AD, it became one of the most significant medieval abbeys in the country, the burial place of two queens and the scene of Civil War upheavals. OPEN: Mon-Sat 9am-5pm, Sun 12pm-3pm
Peterborough Museum	Peterborough PE1 1LF	13.7 miles	01733 864663	Located in one of the city's most historic buildings, Peterborough Museum has a wealth of stories to fascinate and enthral the whole family. The collections comprise over 200,000 items of great national and international importance. OPEN: Tue-Sun 10am-5pm
Rutland County Museum	Oakham LE15 6HW	11.1 miles	01572 758440	Rutland County Museum & Visitor Centre is the perfect introduction to England's smallest county. The museum hosts an exciting programme of Exhibitions and Events. Visitor information, a gift shop, study area and a garden. Admission is free. OPEN: Mon, Wed, Fri, Sat 10am-4pm. CLOSED: Tues, Thurs, Sun
Stamford's Eleanor Cross	Stamford PE9 2RB	0.2 miles	N/A	The Eleanor crosses were a series of twelve tall and lavishly decorated stone monuments topped with crosses, of which three survive nearly intact, in a line down part of the east of England. King Edward I had the crosses erected between 1291 and 1294 in memory of his wife Eleanor of Castile, marking the nightly resting-places along the route taken when her body was transported to London.
Stamford Town Hall	Stamford PE9 2DR	338ft	01780 753808	This historic building was purpose built in 1728 and houses an extensive collection of regalia. Visit the Sir Malcolm Sargent Room. Free admission, donations to the renovation of the Town Hall. Call to book. OPEN: For tours on Fridays

St Leonards Priory	Stamford PE9 2EU	0.5 miles	N/A	Part of the precinct of St Leonard's Priory, Stamford, a cell of the cathedral monastery of Durham. Includes the upstanding remains of the nave of the priory church and the buried remains of the north aisle, transepts, chancel and claustral buildings.
The Priests House	Easton on the Hill PE9 3LS	2.7 miles	01832 205158	The Priest's House is one of the National Trust's smallest buildings. Located in the village of Easton on the Hill, adjacent to the former Rectory which dates from about 1700. Exhibitions are manned every Sunday in June, July and August from 2.00pm to 4.30pm. At other times, access to the Priest's House is obtained between 10am and 5pm by visiting one of the nearby keyholders, whose names are posted on the notice board.
Whissendine Windmill	Whissendine LE15 7EU	16.1 miles	01664 474172	One of England's few remaining fully operational nineteenth-century windmills. Today, fully restored, it produces plain, strong white and wholemeal flour. The Mill was built in 1809 by the Earls of Harborough of Stapleford Park. Whissendine flour is available for purchase at Whissendine's Mace village store. Visitors are welcome when the Mill is working OPEN: Mon-Fri 8am-7pm, Sat 8am-6pm, Sun 8am-12pm
Woolsthorpe Manor	Grantham NG33 5PD	15 miles	01476 860338	Woolsthorpe Manor is the birthplace and was the family home of Sir Isaac Newton. Stand in the room where he used a prism to split sunlight into the colours of the rainbow. From the window you can see the apple tree in the orchard which inspired his theory of gravity. OPEN: Entry to the manor is by timed entry. Site, including coffee shop, gardens and science discovery centre open from 11am to 4.30pm daily.
Yew Tre Avenue	Oakham LE15 7SE	12.8 miles	N/A	Clipsham Yew Tree Avenue is a unique collection of 150 yew trees, most over 200 years old. The Avenue was once the carriage drive to Clipsham Hall, the centre of the Clipsham Estate. A small car park gives year-round access to the Yew Tree Avenue.

The chapel holds memorials to generations of the Cecil family, many of whom are buried in the burial vault beneath the floor.
